

Expectations for the Ojibway Recreation Program Swimming Instructors

Swimming Head

Along with meeting the expectations for, both, Ojibway Recreation Program Staff, and Ojibway Recreation Program **Head** Instructors, you will...

- Be comfortable swimming in a lake, which can be cold and/or wavy
- Hold a valid National Lifeguard Service (NLS) Award (**Note:** the “NLS–Waterfront” option is preferred)
- Hold valid, up to date, Lifesaving Society “Swim Instructor” and “Lifesaving Instructor” certifications, thereby enabling you to offer our campers the opportunity to earn their Lifesaving Society Swim/Patrol/Bronze Medal Awards
- Complete necessary Lifesaving Society paperwork in a timely fashion, thereby enabling campers to **receive** their swim levels at our two Sports Award Dinners
- Work with the Activities Head/Recreation Head to bring a Lifesaving Society swim examiner to the Ojibway, as necessary (e.g., pre–camp, etc...)
- Be responsible for planning and delivering the Swimming programming.
- Deliver programming that will help our campers earn their Lifesaving Society swim/lifeguard levels
- Complete all major planning **prior** to the opening of Camp, so that we have adequate time to organize/purchase/update necessary equipment
- Communicate equipment needs/issues promptly to Activities Head/Recreation Head
- Work alongside the Activities Head to continually develop and improve the organization and delivery of any/all aspects of our Swimming program
- Develop new ideas/ways to improve Ojibway’s Swimming program (e.g., a Recreation Program Diving Club, Snorkelling periods, etc...)
- Work alongside the 5 Head Counsellors to provide programming that is age appropriate. In order to do this, you must work collaboratively with our Counsellors and embrace new ideas and opportunities for development
- Be flexible and willing to adapt/modify programming as required (e.g., if the Seniors want to have a “Canoe Trip” themed week, you should be able to design lessons that relate to this theme)

- Work alongside the Activities Head to manage, address, and continue to improve the safety of the Ojibway Recreation Program's water activities
- Lifeguard/manage water safety during special programming/outings (e.g., on Picnics)

- Help the Swimming Head complete necessary Lifesaving Society paperwork in a timely fashion, thereby enabling campers to **receive** their swim levels at our two Sports Award Dinners
- Help the Swimming Head bring a Lifesaving Society swim examiner to the Ojibway, as necessary (e.g., pre-camp, etc...)
- Help the Swimming Head plan and deliver the Swimming programming.
- Help the Swimming Head deliver programming that will allow our campers to earn their Lifesaving Society swim/lifeguard levels
- Be aware of the planning the Swimming Head completed **prior** to the opening of Camp, and, therefore, what is being organized for the upcoming summer in Canoeing/Kayaking
- Communicate equipment needs/issues promptly to Activities Head/Recreation Head
- Work alongside the Swimming Head to continually develop and improve the organization and delivery of any/all aspects of our Swimming program
- Help the Swimming Head develop new ideas/ways to improve Ojibway's Swimming program (e.g., a Recreation Program Diving Club, Snorkelling periods, etc...)

- Help the Swimming Head work alongside the 5 Head Counsellors to provide programming that is age appropriate. In order to do this, you must work collaboratively with our Counsellors and embrace new ideas and opportunities for development
- Help the Swimming Head be flexible and willing to adapt/modify programming as required (e.g., if the Seniors want to have a “Canoe Trip” themed week, you should be able to design lessons that relate to this theme)
